# Ordinance No. 1235

AN ORDINANCE Fixing the Property Tax Rate and Providing for the Date and Condition of Payment for the Year 2018.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Commissioners of the City of Paris, Tennessee, that the following shall be the
property tax rate and conditions by which they may be paid for the year 2018.
SECTION 1. A tax of \$73 per hundred dollars (\$100) of assessed valuation on all taxable property, real and
personal, within the corporate limits of the City of Paris, be and hereby is levied for the use of the City of Paris, Tennessee, for
the taxable year of 2018.
SECTION 2. All taxes on property, both real and personal, shall be due and payable upon the effective date of
this ordinance and shall become delinquent on the first (1st) day of March, 2019. In the event that payment is not made before
March 1, 2019, the amount of said tax will become delinquent and a penalty of one and one-half percent (1.5%) for each month
thereafter for twelve months upon all taxes remaining shall be imposed and collected by the City and paid into the City Treasur
SECTION 3. All ordinance and parts of ordinances or resolutions in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.
SECTION 4. This ordinance shall take effect on the first day of October, 2018.

#### **ORDINANCE NO. 1236**

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF PARIS, TENNESSEE ADOPTING THE ANNUAL BUDGET FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING JULY 1, 2018 AND ENDING JUNE 30, 2019

- WHEREAS, *Tennessee Code Annotated* Title 9 Chapter 1 Section 116 requires that all funds of the State of Tennessee and all its political subdivisions shall first be appropriated before being expended and that only funds that are available shall be appropriated; and
- WHEREAS, the Municipal Budget Law of 1982 requires that the governing body of each municipality adopt and operate under an annual budget ordinance presenting a financial plan with the information required by that state statute and that no municipality may expend any moneys regardless of the source except in accordance with a budget ordinance and that the City Commission shall not make any appropriations in excess of estimated available funds except to provide for an actual emergency threatening the health, property or life of the inhabitants of the City of Paris; and
- WHEREAS, the City Commission has published the annual operating budget in a newspaper of general circulation not less than ten (10) days prior to the meeting when the City Commission will consider final passage of the budget; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF PARIS. TENNESSEE AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The City Commission of the City of Paris does adopt the following revenue schedule for fiscal Year 2019:
