4-301. Electrical Code Adopted. Pursuant to authority granted by T.C.A. 6-54-501 *et seq.* and for the purpose of providing practical minimum standards for the safeguarding of persons and of buildings and their contents from hazards arising from the use of electricity for light, heat, power, communication, and for other purposes, the 2006 NFPA1 Uniform Fire Code (UFC) and all referenced NFPA documents referenced within 2006 NFPA1 (UFC) are hereby adopted and incorporated by reference as a part of this code and is hereinafter referred to as the "Electrical Code" (Ord. #395, 02/21/68; Ord. #420, 04/09/70; Ord. #206, Section 1, 1947, modified, Ord. #679, 03/03/88; Ord. #738, 08/17/90; Ord. #864, 10/06/94; Ord. #934, 06/02/98; Ord. #1063, 9/7/06; Ord. #1082, 2/7/08.)

4-302. Available in recorder's office. Pursuant to the requirements of Section 6-621 of the Tennessee Code Annotated, three (3) copies of the electrical code have been placed on file in the recorder's office and shall be kept there for the use and inspection of the public.

4-303. Permit required for doing electrical work. No electrical work shall be done within this municipality until a permit therefor has been issued by the municipality. The term "electrical work" shall not be deemed to include minor repairs that do not involve the installation of new wire, conduits, machinery, apparatus or other electrical devices generally requiring the services of an electrician.

4-304. Violations. It shall be unlawful for any person to do or authorize any electrical work or to use any electricity in such manner or under such circumstances as not to comply with this chapter and/or the requirements and standards prescribed by the electrical code.

4-305. Enforcement. The electrical inspector shall be such person as the Board of Public Utilities shall appoint or designate. It shall be his duty to enforce compliance with this chapter and the electrical code as herein adopted by reference. He is authorized and directed to make such inspections of electrical equipment and wiring, etc., as are necessary to insure compliance with the applicable regulations, and may enter any premises or building at any reasonable time for the purpose of discharging his duties. He is authorized to refuse or disconnect electrical service to any person or place not complying with this chapter and/or electrical code.
